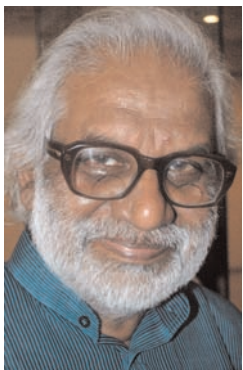


SASNET seminar on

Monday 11 May 2009, 13.15–15.00

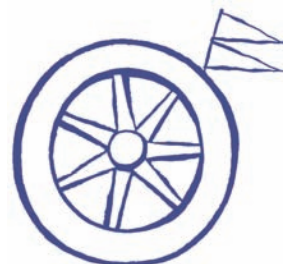

Dipak Malik, Director of the Gandhian Institute and also Professor at the Dept. of Commerce, Banaras Hindu University (BHU) in Varanasi, will talk about the ongoing elections for the Indian parliament, Lok Sabha (results to be announced on May 16th), and the profile of Indian communal riots, now and in the past. He focuses on how the Left and secular forces rescue the society from the disturbed scene and restore the health of society. Professor Malik's research has mainly focused on labour market and trade unions. He has extensive experience of international cooperation and has been guest professor at University of West Indies St. Augustine, Trinidad & Tobago; and University of York, Ontario, Canada. Prof. Malik has been invited to Sweden with a guest lecture programme grant from SASNET.
