Approaches to Central Asia and Afghanistan tend to revolve around issues of Soviet legacy, geo-political interests, or resource and security concerns. All too often the focus is on state-level policies rather than taking local and inter-regional dynamics into consideration. However, it is the on-the-ground and localised dynamics that influence political stability and border security. Central Asia is indeed a context of insurgency, the narcotics trade, and complex ethno-nationalisms.

This seminar, therefore, has as its primary focus the implications the ethno-political currents have both on the strategy of international actors and the Central Asian states themselves. The fraught political boundaries between the Central Asian states will be taken as the starting point from which the contemporary issues that have ramifications for policy makers outside the region will be discussed. The region is seeing an increased presence of non-traditional actors such as NATO and the OSCE, and the seminar seeks to focus on how the interaction between different localised groups is influenced by the emergence of these new geo-political forces and interests.

The seminar will mark the launch of a FIIA Report compiled by Dr. Steven Parham.
