Manjushree (Mental Health Care & Cure) Society, L-19, Kamayani Colony, Varanasi 221010. Consolidated report of activities (2002-2008)

Manjushree in the last six years have provided academic and professional support to mental health in Indian community, particularly the rural population.

A brief introduction of the activities is as follows:-

1. Workshops and seminars:-

- (a) A workshop was conducted on June 6, 2002 on the topic "Objectives of Manjushree: Effective implementation" in New Delhi in which many experienced psychologists and social workers participated. To make the programme more effective it was decided to take up backward rural area in Muzaffarpur (Bihar) and urban population in Varanasi at the first instance.
- (b) A seminar 0n " Mental health care: problems and prospects" was organized on 21.7.2002 at Muzaffarpur, Bihar. Local social workers, sociologists, psychologists and medical practiceners participated and contributed their valuable inputs. The aim was to focus on the needs and requirements of the underdeveloped, particularly scheduled castes and backward communities.

 Local centre was inaugurated by the Vice-chancellor Prof. N.N.Singh of B.R.A.Bihar Uniersity. Mr. Ram Kumar Singh, Social worker & Ex. M.L.C presided over the function and Prof. B.N.Singh, Ex. Head of Dept, Psychology, was the chief guest.
- (c) A seminar on "Mental Health: Preventive Measures" was jointly organized by Manjushree and Gandhi Addhyayan Peeth of M.G.Kashi Vidyapith, Varanasi on the World Mental Health Day in 2006. It was well attended by the academicians, social workers, media persons.

2. Courses organized: -

- (a) A two-day workshop was conducted on "Counselling effectiveness through plain folk device of community interaction in scheduled castes and scheduled tribes" in Varanasi on 27.4.2004. It was aimed for by mental health practiceners and clinical psychology students.
- (b) Similar workshop was organized in Muzaffarpur on 7.5.2005 which was very successful.

3. Action programmes in communities: -

- 1. Three villages of Baruraj P.S. of Muzaffarpur district were selected for their all round development. These were Meghua, Harauna and Morsandi.
- 2. Similarly, three villages of Karja P.S. of Muzaffarpur district, Rasulpur,Rupwara and Rupauli, were earmarked for the same purpose. These villages have mostly backward and scheduled caste population with extreme poverty. Door to door service was provided to them for their all round development. The service was provided to all members of the family. Constant care was exercised for their improvement with all kinds of possible support. The outcome revealed increase in self esteem, social security, will for better living and proper management of adverse situation. Children and adolescents appeared to benefit more of the intervention. It took much time and effort as the help was individual tailored one.

4. Personal services:-

- (a) Clinical aids have been provided to about 800 persons of Varanasi, Muzaffarpur and New Delhi who needed it. The group constitutes youth, children and aged.
- (b) Approximately 2400 students of Varanasi (Uttar pradesh) and Muzaffarpur (Bihar) have been tested psychologically and required counselling have been provided for their development.
- (c) Parental counselling is also being provided at Varanasi and Muzaffarpur through schools on many occasions. This has been very effective. Parents of adolescent children have benefited the most.

5. Additional resposibilities:-

In personal capacity, the chairman, Prof. G.P.Thakur, on exclusive demand, provided clinical services to ENERCON, Bombay and to VIMHANS, New Delhi on many occasions.

Since such a service in based more on confidence of people and people did not like to be branded as mentally unstable any news was not given to any one including the media about intervention.
