Academic qualifications:

I have taught and guided students at all levels in theory, methods, and my special fields of development studies (at the departments of Sociology and Cultural Geography at Lund University). Jointly with other teachers I have in 1994-96 organised a Masters Course in Rural Development at the department of Sociology.

I have also undertaken a number of shorter fieldworks in various parts of India (1967, 1972, 1976/77, 1989, 1991, 1992, and 1993, 1997) and in Taiwan (1997, six weeks), and I have made shorter trips to Thailand, South Korea, Chile, Bangladesh, Algeria, and Uganda to give lectures and discuss research exchange and projects.

I have edited academic and other journals, and I have given guest lectures at various universities in Europe, India and the United States. I was guest professor at the department of Sociology, University of California, Los Angeles in April - May 1988.
